First of all they love Jesus and second of all they love each other. They have been best friends for many years; truly a marriage made in heaven. Helen who is not long for this world spends her time making warm hats for the homeless. These two are perfect examples of what Jesus want us to do. They abide in love for each other and everyone around them. Remember; **God is love**, and whoever remains in **love** remains in **God** and **God** in him. 1 John 4.

So we all need to take a lesson from Bobby and Helen, for they truly accept their fate and abide in Love for God and each other. So how do I explain why the most kind and Loving God would allow His followers to suffer so much. It seems fair to me that the rich and lucky folks should have to suffer, but not his disciples. So first I turned to the Apostle he chose to lead the church, Peter. In Peter chap 2 vs 20 he states; "but if when you do what is right and suffer for it you patiently endure it, this finds favor with God. For you have been called for this purpose, since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His steps. We find the JOY of Christ in our hearts because, the Word of God says; "eye has not seen and ear has not heard, And which have not entered the heart of man, All that God has prepared for those who love Him." 1 Corinthians 2. Your reward in heaven will be great if you sincerely turn your heart to Him, are sorry for your sins and ask Jesus into your heart. But like my dear friends Bobby and Helen you must love Him with your whole heart, your whole soul and your entire mind and all your strength. Which means that you will love and forgive your neighbors every wrong they have done to you? THEN you will be truly FREE and full of Gods Joy. Learn from the lives of others who have found God and loved their neighbors. We in the Catholic Church call them Saints.
