(2 Corinthians 5:20)	As Lent reaches its halfway point, recommit yourself to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to purify your heart for the Paschal feast.	"To worship God on Sundays, then, is not the mere observance of a rule but the fulfillment of our identity, of who we are as members of the Body of Christ. Participation in the Mass is an act of love."  (USCCB, <i>The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church</i> , no. 28)	Take some time today to read Scripture or <u>listen to</u> the daily readings.	"The evangelizing efforts of the baptized are not simply focused on those who have not heard of Christ. They are also directed toward our brothers and sisters who no longer join us around the Lord's table. Furthermore, the baptized disciple of Christ is also continually evangelized through ongoing renewal of faith and living out that same faith."  (USCCB, Living as Missionary Disciples, p. 6)	Instead of playing practical jokes, follow St. Paul's example: "We are fools on Christ's account, but you are wise in Christ; we are weak, but you are strong; you are held in honor, but we in disrepute" (1 Cor 4:10). Pray that your interaction on social media will be marked by respect and model the love to which Christ calls us.	Pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary for the Pope's Intention for April: For health care workers who serve the sick and the elderly, especially in the poorest countries; may they be adequately supported by governments and local communities.	"The person who shares worthily in the Eucharist is enabled more and more to live the new law of love given by Christ precisely because Christ communicates himself in the sacrament of the altar. The foundation of our personal and moral transformation is the communion with himself that Christ establishes in Baptism and deepens in the Eucharist."
